NOTICE OF RACE

1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

1.1 The organising authority is the Royal Solent Yacht Club.

2. RULES

- 2.1 The races will be governed by the current World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 (RRS) including the prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association, the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions and any relevant class rules.
- 2.2 RRS 35 and 40 are changed in the Sailing Instructions.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 Boats shall not be deemed to be racing unless the owner or person in charge has completed and returned the attached entry form together with the required fee for this event to the RSYC Sailing Office.
- 3.2 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 3.3 All competitors under the age of 18 on 13th August 2018 must ensure that their entry form and parental consent form is signed by a parent or guardian.

4. FEES

4.1 Racing for 2 days is £10. Daily entry is £5.00.

5. CLASSES

- 5.1 Classes will include:
 - WW Scow (Wooden)
 - YSC Scow (GRP)
- 5.2 Classes may be combined at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 5.3 There must be at least two entries in order to run a class.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Registration for scow sailors will be on Wednesday 15th August at 9.30am in the Hudleston Bar of the RSYC, with a briefing at 9.45am.
- 6.2 There will be two races run back to back each day. At the discretion of the Race Officers additional races may be run. Competitors will need to check with the Principal Race Officer.
- 6.3 The scheduled time of the first warning signal will not be before 11.00am.

7. RACING AREA

7.1 Racing will be in the area of Bouldnor Bay.

8. PROTESTS

8.1 The Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available.

9. SCORING

- 9.1 The low point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will apply
- 9.2 In each class 2 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

10.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at RSYC or to down load from www.royalsolent.org from 10th August 2018.

11. PRIZES

- 11.1 Trophies will be awarded to the overall winner in each class in the regatta.
- 11.2 The Prize Giving will take place after racing on Thursday 16th August at the RSYC.

12. RISK STATEMENT

- 12.1 Rule 4 of RRS states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." Sailing is by nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor or if a junior it's parent or guardian agrees and acknowledges that:
 - (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk while taking part in the event;
 - (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other propery whether afloat or ashore;
 - (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - (d) The boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
 - (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the race organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
 - (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
 - (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the venue or event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

13. INSPECTION

The fact that race officials may carry out inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor for ensuring compliance with the above.

14. INSURANCE

14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 (three million pounds sterling), or the equivalent, per incident.
