#### **NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

#### **VISITORS**

The Commodore, Flag Officers and Members of the Royal Solent Yacht Club extend a warm welcome to Members of the Folkboat Association as visitors to the Club. You are requested to sign and enter your name and address in the Visitors' Book, situated at the top of the stairs and should acquaint yourselves with the rules of the Royal Solent Yacht Club particularly those concerning dress.

#### **AVOIDING POSSIBLE COLLISION WITH FERRIES**

Competitors are reminded that under rule 9 (b) of the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea "a vessel of less than 20 metres in length or a sailing vessel shall not impede the passage of any other vessel navigating within a narrow channel or fairway". The approach to Yarmouth Harbour between the Harbour East buoy and the harbour is considered to be a fairway.

Ferries have extreme difficulty in strong winds and tides when approaching or leaving Yarmouth Harbour and competitors should err on the side of safety and give way early if there is any possible doubt.

#### **RYA RACING CHARTER**

Competitors should note that the Royal Solent Yacht Club implements the RYA Racing Charter and they will be required to undertake to sail in accordance with the Charter, which can be found in the front pages of the World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing or at <a href="Racing\_Charter">Racing\_Charter (rya.org.uk)</a>

#### **ENTRY FORM**

Competitors MUST complete the entry online via the RSYC website **prior to taking part.** It is essential that this form is **completed in FULL**. Competitors will not be allowed to race without an entry.

In entering Folkboat Week participants accept that neither the Royal Solent Yacht Club nor its representatives shall bear any responsibility for any loss, damage, death, or personal injury howsoever caused to any boat, skipper or crew.

#### **WHATSAPP**

Boats must register a mobile number to receive general information by WhatsApp, any information taken in such a manner will not be binding. Information given over the radio will take precedence over any other electronic protocol.



#### SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Abbreviations:

RRS: Racing Rules of Sailing

NFIAR: Nordic Folkboat International Association Rules UK FARR: Folkboat Association Class Rules and Regulations.

RSYC: Royal Solent Yacht Club.

RLymYC: Royal Lymington Yacht Club.

TCF: Time Correction Factor.

SI: Sailing Instructions. NOR: Notice of Race.

#### 1 ORGANISING AUTHORITY.

The Organising Authority is the Royal Solent Yacht Club.

#### 2 THE RULES

- 2.1 The event will be governed by the Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing
- 2.2 The following RRS are changed:
- 2.2.1 The Protest Committee may decide the penalty for breaches of any Rule, other than a Rule within RRS Parts 1 and 2. This modifies RRS 64.2(a).
- 2.2.2 RRS 35 (time limits) is changed by SI.11
- 2.2.3 RRS 28.1 is modified by the addition of:

The race committee may disqualify (DSQ) without a hearing a boat that has broken this rule but only when two members of the race committee have seen the incident. The boat so disqualified will be informed by notification in the race results and may in addition be informed by VHF Radio.

2.2.4. Penalties; see NOR 11

#### 3 **CLASS RULES**; see NOR 4

- 3.1 The NFIAR and UK FARR shall apply, except that there shall be no penalty for a breach of NFIAR 13.10 (Crew Limitation) or of NFIAR 8.20 (headsail furling) and NFIAR 1.11 (engines).
- 3.2 All helmsmen must be Full or Associate Members of the UK Folkboat Association Class and shall have paid their subscriptions for 2024 before 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024.
- 3.3 Breaches of UK FARR A3.3 (eligibility) may be waived at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 3.4 Outboard engines may remain on the transom of Classic vessels whilst racing.

## 4 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS AND CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS; see NOR 3 and 7.2

4.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official Folkboat Week Notice Board in the RSYC.

#### 5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 All signals made ashore will be displayed inferior to Flag F from The Royal Solent Yacht Club flagstaff.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 60 minutes" in the race postponement signal AP.

#### 6 CLASS FLAGS

- 6.1 The Open Division class and warning flag will be flag "F". The Classic Division class and warning flag will be flag "A".
- 6.2 All boats shall fly their class flag on their backstay.
- 6.3 All boats shall fly the sponsor's flag "Lymington Yacht Haven" from their backstay.
- 6.4 There will be no race unless a minimum of 2 boats start in a race. This changes Rule 90.3 (a)




#### 7 **RACE AREA**; see NOR 8.

#### 8 COURSES/OBSTRUCTION

- 8.1 Boats, when racing shall pass to the south of all booms, beacons and posts in the Lymington River entrance, including the RLymYC starting platform and inner distance mark and the barrier and beacon off Durns Point.
- 8.2 Boats shall pass to the north of the buoy 'Roach Pittis'' (yellow base with white cone) situated south east of the inner trot of harbour moorings to the west of Yarmouth Harbour entrance.
- 8.3 Each mark (navigation buoy or special racing mark) has been allocated a symbol (letter or a number) as shown in Appendix 3 and 4
- 8.4 The course to be sailed may be indicated by the symbols displayed on boards on one side of the Committee Boat. The symbols will be displayed in the order in which the marks shall be rounded or passed. Marks indicated by symbols on a green background shall be rounded or passed to starboard. Marks indicated by symbols shown on a red background shall be rounded or passed to port.
- 8.5 Windward Leeward Races refer to SI 8.10. Other courses may be announced on VHF Channel 37. Failure of any boat to receive any such transmissions shall not be grounds for any protest or any request for redress.
- 8.6 All marks shall be rounding marks unless the alteration of course is less than 90 degrees when they shall be passing marks.
- 8.7 When two or three white diamond shapes are displayed with the course signal the course shall be sailed two or three times round respectively. Boats shall pass through the gate formed by the Committee Boat and a Distance Mark from the direction of the previous mark at the end of each round before commencing the next round.
- 8.8 When '\(\sigma\)' is displayed as part of the course signal, it indicates that boats shall pass through the gate described in SI 8.7 from the direction of the previous mark.
- 8.9 When one or more movable marks (symbol N or M) is in the course, their approximate magnetic bearing from the Committee Boat may be displayed at the warning signal. Bearings may be in three figure degree notation. If one or more movable marks are in the course, one or more bearings may be displayed in the order in which the marks are to be rounded or passed.
- 8.10 For Windward Leeward Events the courses will be indicated by either a red or a green flag or board flown from the Committee Boat. The diagram below is based on the red course (port rounding). For the green course (starboard rounding) the diagram would be reversed.





#### Boats shall NOT pass through the Start/Finish line on the downwind leg.

#### 8.11 Shortening the course:

In addition to RRS 32, when the race committee believe that boats are unlikely to finish within the



time limit or boats do not finish with the time limit, the race committee may score boats in the order, corrected on handicap if appropriate, that they passed through the last gate or mark at which the race committee are able to establish a finishing order. Such a line becomes the finishing line for those boats. This changes RRS 35, RRS A4 and RRS A9.

8.12 In addition to RRS 32. When a race committee vessel near a designated mark of the course is displaying flag S over H with repetitive sound signals, that mark and the committee vessel shall become a gate. This may change the required side of the mark. Boats shall pass through the gate and sail to the Finish.

#### 9 THE START

- 9.1 The Committee Boat will be identified by a Royal Solent Yacht Club burgee at the masthead and a white banner with ROYAL SOLENT YC COMMITTEE thereon. Its approximate position may be announced on VHF 37 or via the event messaging system.
- 9.2 Boats are requested to identify themselves by displaying their sail numbers before the start of each race by passing close to the Committee Boat on the opposite side to the starting line. Boats not so identified may not be finished.
- 9.3 Races will be started using RRS 26 with the warning signal five minutes before the starting signal.
- 9.4 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Committee Boat and the course side of the outer distance mark.
- 9.5 The Classic Division will start 10 minutes after the Open Division, except races 6, 7 & 8 when the start will be 5 minutes after the Open Division.
- 9.6 Information with regard to OCS boats may be transmitted on VHF Radio channel 37. Failure of any boat to receive any such transmissions shall not be grounds for any protest or any request for redress

#### 10 THE FINISH

- 10.1 The finishing line will be between the staff displaying a blue flag on the Committee Boat and an orange inflatable buoy. EXCEPT that on the last or only race of the day the finishing Committee Boat identified by flying a blue flag may relocate or moor off the Royal Solent Yacht Club. The finish, if off the Royal Solent Yacht Club, will then be between the finishing Committee Boat and the Royal Solent Yacht Club outer distance mark.
- Boats shall cross the finish line from the direction of the last mark. If an inner distance mark is laid, boats shall pass between it and the outer distance mark.
- 10.3 Boats shall keep well clear of the finishing line after finishing.

#### 11 TIME LIMIT

#### RRS 35 is varied so that:

- 11.1 The time limits will be as laid out in Appendix 1.
- 11.2 If no boat finishes within Time Limit 1, the race committee shall abandon the race. The finishing window is the time allocated for the boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes (Time Limit 2).
- 11.3 For races of more than one round when the first boat in her race fails to finish within Time Limit 1, but has completed one or more rounds of the course, the results of the race may be determined by the placings at the end of the last completed round by the first boat.
- When the first boat in her race fails to complete a round of the course or to pass though the gate when 'gate' is part of the course, by Time Limit 1, the race shall be abandoned, unless shortened.
- 11.5 When '\(\sigma\)' is a mark of the course if the first boat in her race fails to complete the course by Time Limit 1, the results of the race will be determined by the placings of the boats through the gate.



#### 12 PROTESTS

- 12.1 A protesting boat shall notify the Committee Boat by VHF channel 37 of her intention to protest within ten minutes after finishing a race or as soon as possible after retiring from a race and advise the number(s) of the protested boat(s) and receive acknowledgement.
- 12.2 Protests shall be written on forms available from The Royal Solent Yacht Club Race Office and be lodged there within one and a half hours of the protesting boat finishing the last race of the day or the Race Committee signalling "No more racing today" whichever is the later. RRS 61.3 is varied accordingly.
- 12.3 The time and place of protest hearings will be posted on the official Folkboat Week Notice Board in the Royal Solent Yacht Club, and may be sent via the event messaging system.
- 12.4 RYA Rules Dispute Advisory and Mediation Hearings are available and shall be the first recourse used in dispute resolution. RRS 62.2a does not apply.

- 14 RISK STATEMENT; see NOR 13
- 15 **INSURANCE**; see NOR 15

#### 16 SAFETY

- 16.1 A boat is entirely responsible for its own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing, whether in the Notice of Race or these Sailing Instructions or anywhere else, reduces this responsibility.
- 16.2 All boats shall comply with NOR 12 (Safety Regulations).

#### 17 PRIZES

17.1 Prizes will be awarded as stated in NOR 16.


