Cruise to Gins Farm Thursday 13th June 2024

Although we were booked in for 1300hrs. we had a long wait for service but this gave us a great time for pre-prandial rehydration and conversation! The food was good and despite the slow service, we all got away by 1500hrs.

The Royal Southampton Commodore came down to the pontoon to thank us for our support but missed Martyn and Kathy who had to catch a ferry. Luckily Jon and Caroline were still there and passed the message on.

I was pleasantly surprised by the sea conditions on the return trip; it was choppy and wet on the little R.I.B. but the wind had turned more to the south so we had some shelter on the Island shore. We made it to Yarmouth in about half an hour from the entrance to the Beaulieu river and dropped Jojo off on the harbour pontoon. David and Bol were not so lucky on Second Wind being caught in a heavy squall. Jojo had borrowed David's sailing coat for her trip on our R.I.B. so he had to shelter in the cockpit whilst Bol helmed and proved the waterproofing of his new wet weather gear!
