## KEY COVID REGULATIONS

Please help the Club's staff to make this prestigious regatta as enjoyable and safe as possible by adhering to the Covid regulations still in force and risk controls detailed below.

- All attendees must be seated when drinking or eating inside or outside (it is not permitted to stand up or walk around with a glass or food in hand).
- Face coverings must be worn inside the Club and inside the marquees if the sides are down due to bad weather. Except by anyone exempt from wearing a face covering.
- Mingling with others from outside your group is not permitted.
- Please maintain social distancing from those outside your group, staff and volunteer members.
- There is a maximum limit of 3 persons in the cloakrooms at any one time.
- Please queue socially distanced at 1m+ where required, e.g. for registration and the cloakrooms.
- Table service is in operation for both drinks and food, with no bar service.
- Payment via credit/debit cards rather than cash please.
- Please keep voices at a moderate level with no shouting or singing.
