NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

VISITORS

The Flag Officers and Members of the Royal Solent Yacht Club extend a warm welcome to competitors as visitors to the Club. They are requested to sign and enter their name in the Visitors' Book situated in the foyer on the first floor landing and should acquaint themselves with the Byelaws of the Royal Solent Yacht Club, posted on the Club website.

AVOIDING POSSIBLE COLLISION WITH FERRIES

Competitors are reminded that under rule 9 (b) of the International Regulations for reventing Collisions at Sea "a vessel of less than 20 metres in length or a sailing vessel shall not impede the passage of any other vessel navigating within a narrow channel or fairway". The approach to Yarmouth Harbour between the Harbour East buoy and the harbour is considered to be a fairway. Ferries have extreme difficulty in strong winds and tides when approaching or leaving Yarmouth Harbour and competitors should err on the side of safety and give way early if there is any possible doubt.

RYA RACING CHARTER

Competitors should note that the Royal Solent Yacht Club implements the RYA Racing Charter and they will be required to undertake to sail in accordance with the Charter, which can be found in the front pages of the World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing or at the RYA website: Racing Charter

ENTRY FORM

Competitors MUST complete the Condition of Entry Form online via the RSYC website prior to taking part in their first race of the season. It is essential that this form is completed in FULL. Competitors will not be allowed to race without a completed form.

AMENDMENTS

Any information displayed at the Club may be displayed on the RSYC website-www.royalsolent.org, via WhatsApp, by phoning the RSYC Sailing Office on 01983 760256 or by contacting the class captain. In the event of bad weather on the day of the race, competitors are advised to check via one of these methods. Failure to display information on the Club's website or not being able to contact a class captain, will not be grounds for redress.

STANDARD SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SI)

2025

1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

1.1 The Organising Authority is the Royal Solent Yacht Club (RSYC).

2. RULES

- 2.1 Events are governed by the Rules as defined in the RRS, the Condition of Entry Form and these SI, including the Appendices.
- 2.2 RRS 32.1 is changed by adding paragraph 32.1(e): for any reason deemed necessary by the race committee.
- 2.3 RRS 44 is changed so that the Two-Turn Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.
- 2.4 If asked by the Sailing Office to assist in the running of a race, a boat may be awarded her average points for the relevant races.
- 2.5 Folkboats are permitted to use spinnakers as per UK Folkboat Association Class Racing Regulations Part B/2.0 and there will be no penalty for Folkboats that do not comply with NFIA Rule 13.10 (Crew Limitations) or NFIA Class Rule 8.20 (headsail furling).
- 2.6 For IRC boats IRC Rule 22.4.2 shall not apply. There are no limitations on crew number or weight except as required for boats rated as one designs which shall comply with IRC Rule 22.4.1
- 2.7 Boats may be inspected at any time for compliance with the rules as defined by the RRS.

3. EXCLUSION ZONES:

- 3.1 Boats in whatever direction they race, other than dinghy classes, shall pass south of:
 - 3.1.1 The Royal Lymington Yacht Club starting platform.
 - 3.1.2 Cross Boom
 - 3.1.3 Jack in the Basket, all booms, beacons and posts in Lymington River entrance.
 - 3.1.4 The barrier and beacon south of Durns Point.
- 3.2 Boats in whatever direction they are racing shall pass to the north of the yellow buoy situated to the southeast of the inner trot of moorings, located to the west of Yarmouth Pier, sponsored by Roach Pittis.

4. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 4.1. The official notice board is on **Sailing Instructions (royalsolent.org)**
 - 4.1.1 The VHF Channel to be used for race committee broadcasts is channel 72. Competitors should monitor this channel from one hour before their warning signal.
 - 4.1.2 The Event Messaging System for this event will be WhatsApp.
 - 4.1.3 The Race Office is located at the Royal Solent Yacht Club.
 - 4.1.4 Competitors may communicate with the race committee as follows:
 - By telephone to the RSYC on 01983 760256 or mobile number 07970 702702
 - · By email: sailing@royalsolent.org
 - By WhatsApp to the specified group. These messaging groups shall only be used for official communications.
 - · By VHF on Channel 72.

- 4.1.5 The following communications may be made by the race committee on VHF and may be repeated on WhatsApp.
 - · Time check(s)
 - The race area and race schedule each day; any schedule changes
 - · Any change of starting order for multiple class starts
 - · Location of the start & finish lines (ie Committee Boat, Grants or Balcony line)
 - The use of alternate preparatory signals
 - The courses to be sailed and any changes or shortening
 - The approximate bearings and distances to moveable/first marks
 - The warning, preparatory and starting signals for all classes.
 - Between the warning and preparatory signal, any starting penalty flag to be displayed.
 - · Sailing Instruction changes (confirmation of changes posted)
 - · Postponements and abandonments
 - · Individual and general recalls
 - The intended time of the first warning signal of a starting sequence.

5. CONDITION OF ENTRY / ELIGIBILITY

- 5.1 The RSYC Condition of Entry Form shall be completed and submitted prior to that boat's first race of the season. See RRS 76.1.
- 5.2 The online Condition of Entry Form need only be completed once per year; Supplementary Entry Forms are required for some events as specified in the Supp SI.
- 5.3 Throughout these SI, the Supp SI, and the NoR, reference to Folkboat shall be deemed to mean Nordic and British Folkboats.

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 The schedule of races, the classes to race, the order, the date of races and the time of the starting and/or warning signals will be published in the RSYC Programme of Races, the website www.royalsolent.org, and/or in a separately issued NoR and/or Supp SI.
- 6.2 Classes may be combined at the discretion of the race committee.

7. SCORING and MINIMUM ENTRY

7.1 Scores will be in accordance with RRS Appendix A, 'low points system'-RRS A5.3 will apply.

8. HANDICAPS

Club Handicaps, if appropriate, will be determined by the Club's Race Management Committee, or its nominee.

9. CLASS FLAGS & ENSIGNS

- 9.1 All boats shall display their designated class flag.
- 9.2 Ensigns shall be struck prior to the preparatory signal.
- 9.3 Class 1&2 boats may use their engines up to the one-minute signal before the start. This changes RS 42.3(i) This does not apply to open events.

10 IDENTIFICATION ON SAILS

Under exceptional circumstances, the race committee may permit a boat to use sails carrying identification other than those required by RRS 77. Competitors should seek such permission from the race committee in good time, stating reason for the request.

11 CHANGES

Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0900 or no later than 2 hours before the first scheduled race on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect. Attention to changes may be broadcast on VHF before the warning signal of the first race affected.

12 COURSE INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

12.1 Courses will be selected from navigational buoys and racing marks which have been allocated code letters, numbers or symbols as shown on Appendices A & B.

12.2

- (a) The course to be sailed may be displayed at or before the preparatory signal in a frame on the committee boat or at Grants in the frame eastwards of the signal flagstaff when the sequence of letters, numbers, or symbols displayed shall be read from top left to bottom right.
- **(b)** White letters, numbers or symbols on a red background on the committee boat indicate that such marks shall be rounded to port. Similarly, white letters, numbers or symbols on a green background on the committee boat indicate that such marks shall be rounded to starboard.

Red letters, numbers or symbols on a black background at Grants indicate that such marks shall be rounded to port. Similarly, green letters, numbers or symbols on a black background at Grants indicate that such marks shall be rounded to starboard.

- **(c)** At the discretion of the Race Committee, the course may only be transmitted by VHF channel 72 and no course boards will be used.
- (d) When two or three white diamond shapes are displayed as part of the course, the course shall be sailed two or three times round respectively. Boats shall pass through the gate formed by the committee boat and a distance mark, or the Grants inner white post and the outer distance mark for Grants from the direction of the previous mark, at the end of each round before commencing the next round.
- **(e)** Races that are doing several laps, but are starting at Grants and finishing at the RSYC balcony line, shall use the gate formed by an imaginary line between the Club balcony and the outer distance mark for Grants for all laps.
- **(f)** When 'D' is displayed as part of the course, it indicates that boats shall pass through the gate described in SI 12.2(d) from the direction of the previous mark.

12.3 Amended Course

When 'S' flag over 'H' flag is displayed by a committee boat adjacent to a mark of the course, it denotes that boats shall pass that mark on the required side and shall then proceed directly to cross the finishing line in the direction from that mark. The committee boat may make repeated sound signals to draw attention to the visual signal.

13 **START INSTRUCTION**

13.1 Starting Line (Grants)

The starting line at Grants is approximately 200 metres to the east of the RSYC. The starting line is formed by bringing the signal flagstaff bearing a horizontally striped orange and white diamond shape into line with a white post topped with a white diamond framed white cross which is about 15 metres to seawards from the sea wall.

13.2 <u>Inner and Outer Distance Marks (Grants)</u>

(a) The inner limit mark for all races is the seaward post with a diamond shaped top

of the starting line transit. Please note that this mark may not necessarily be in water deep enough for some boats.

- (b) The outer distance mark for all races from Grants, (except for dinghy classes), is a yellow cylindrical buoy marked with '9' in black, River Yar Boatyard, in black thereon with a yellow X top mark, located approximately 450 metres north of the signal flagstaff. Please note depending on the state of tide this buoy may not be in line with the starting line which is formed by bringing the signal flagstaff bearing a horizontally striped orange and white diamond shape into line with a white post topped with a white diamond framed white cross which is about 15 metres to seawards from the sea wall.
- (c) The outer distance mark for dinghy classes is a yellow buoy with '19' thereon and a yellow top mark about 120 metres north of the signal flagstaff at Grants. Please note depending on the state of tide this buoy may not be in line with the starting line which is formed by bringing the signal flagstaff bearing a horizontally striped orange and white diamond shape into line with a white post topped with a white diamond framed white cross which is about 15 metres to seawards from the sea wall.

13.3 <u>Starting Line (Club balcony)</u>

The outer distance mark for all races from the Club Balcony, is a yellow cylindrical buoy marked with '9' in black, River Yar Boatyard, in black thereon with a yellow X top mark, located approximately 450 metres north of the signal flagstaff. Please note depending on the state of tide this buoy may not be in line with the starting line which is formed by bringing the signal flagstaff bearing a horizontally striped orange and white diamond shape into line with a white post topped with a white diamond framed white cross which is about 15 metres to seawards from the Balcony.

The course will be announced on VHF and WhatsApp.

13.4 <u>Starting line (Committee Boat)</u>

- (a) The committee boat will be identified by an orange flag.
- (b) The starting line will be between an orange flag on the committee boat and the course side of the outer distance mark which may be an orange inflatable mark.
- (c) Please note that the outer distance mark or committee boat may not necessarily be in water deep enough for some boats.

14 FINISH INSTRUCTIONS

14.1 <u>Time Limit:</u>

- (a) The RRS 35 time limit for all races shall be 2 hours (except for XODs on Saturdays). The latest time to finish after the 1st boat finishes is 30 minutes, or the RRS 35 time limit, whichever is the later.
- (b) For races of more than one round, when the first boat in her race fails to finish within the time limit, but has completed one or more rounds of the course, the results of the race may be determined by the placings at the end of the last completed round by the first boat.
- (c) When no boat in the race completes a round of the course or passes through the gate when '□' is part of the course, as described in SI 12.2, by the time limit, the race shall be abandoned, unless shortened.
- (d) Should no boat in the race complete the course within the time limit, the results of the race will be determined by the placings of the boats through the gate when '\(\pi\)' is a mark of the course.

14.2 Finishing Line (Grants)

- (f) The finishing line, (except for dinghy classes), will be the line between the signal flagstaff and the finishing mark which is the yellow cylindrical buoy (No 9), approximately 450 metres north of the signal flagstaff.
- (g) For dinghy classes racing from Grants, the finishing line will be between the signal flagstaff and the yellow spherical buoy (No 19) approximately 120 metres north of the signal flagstaff.

14.3 Finishing Line (Committee Boat)

- (h) The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the committee boat and the course side of the finishing line outer distance mark.
- (i) Boats shall cross the finishing line from the direction of the last mark. If an inner limit mark is laid, boats shall pass between it and the outer distance mark.

14.4 <u>Finishing Line (Club Balcony)</u>

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the eastern end of the club balcony and the outer distance mark (No 9). Dinghies ODM is No 19.

14.5 Boats that have become detached from the fleet will be allowed to radio in and inform the race committee of their predicament and the race committee may agree to give them a finishing time without a penalty. This action will not prejudice their overall results.

15 PROTESTS

- 15.1 The time and place of the hearing will be communicated to the parties involved and it is the responsibility of the protestor and the protestee to acquaint themselves with this information and to present themselves at the appropriate time with any witnesses they may wish to call. See 63.1(b).
- 15.2 For breaches of any rule, other than a rule of RRS Parts 1 and 2 or specified in the rule itself, the penalty may, at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than disqualification.

16 RESULTS

16.1 The results of races may be posted on the Club Website

17 SAFETY/RISK STATEMENT

- 17.1 The crews of all boats that are not fully decked and are capable of raising the keel, centerboard or dagger-board shall wear lifejackets or other adequate personal buoyancy at all times while afloat.
- 17.2 When the Y flag/board is displayed and/or communicated via VHF, all competitors shall wear a personal flotation device.
- 17.3 A boat racing shall, where applicable, comply with its class rules with regard to safety.
- 17.4 Following consultation with the relevant Class Captains, the race committee may initiate 'white sail racing' (no spinnakers). This will be signaled by hoisting flag G and the relevant class flag, or communicated via VHF 72.
- 17.5 VHF radios capable of receiving channel 72 shall be carried by all classes, except dinghy classes, and a listening watch kept at all times. There will be no penalty if this breaks a class rule.
- 17.6 All boats shall keep clear of the starting line during any preceding start sequences.
- 17.7 No boat shall race with an anchor protruding beyond its bow/bowsprit or bumkin, penalty for this rule is DSQ without a hearing and changes A5.1.

- 17.8 A boat which retires from a race shall make every effort to ensure that the race committee is notified as soon as possible and before returning to her berth. Failure to comply may result in a score for that boat that is a Disqualification Not Excludable (DNE).
- 17.9 **Rule 3 of the RRS states:** "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue *racing* is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.

By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the venue or event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
- h) The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out above.

18 Insurance

All boats are required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims including cover for racing in the sum of at least £5,000,000 (five million pounds sterling). By entering, entrants declare that such cover will be maintained in full force at all times while racing, and agree to allow the RSYC, at its discretion, to pass on their contact details to third party insurers in the event of a possible insurance claim.

1. The General NoR and SI shall apply except as changed by this supplement.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

2.1 Series 1: 23^{rd} April ~ 11^{th} June (8 races)

Series 2: 18th June ~ 30th July (7 races)

Series 3: 8^{th} August ~ 17^{th} September (6/7 races)

4 CLASSES/HANDICAPPING

4.1 Classes 1&2 cruiser racers: (these may be separated into two classes if sufficient numbers), NHC handicap.

Class 3: XOD & YOD boats, NHC handicap.

FB: Folkboats, level racing.

Dinghy class: ILCA 4, ILCA 6, ILCA 7, Aero, Pico (race sail), PY handicap. Dinghy entrants shall nominate, prior to their first race in each series, a sail size for that series. Any change to that sail size during the series shall be given in writing to the Sailing Office prior to the start of the race.

5.2 Classes 1&2 boats which are having difficulty crossing the start line (or getting back to it) may, 10 minutes after their start signal, sail straight to the first mark without returning to cross the starting line.

6. TIME LIMIT

RRS 35 time limit is 2000, or 30 minutes after the first boat finishes, or the RRS 35 time limit, whichever is the later.

7. SCORING

- 7.1 Scoring will be in accordance with RRS Appendix A low points system, except that the score for DNC will be decided by the Race Management Committee, the score for DNF will be one more than the number of boats in the race. This changes RRS 35.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The event is open to boats of the following classes:
 - a) IRC/RYA National Handicap for Cruisers;
 - b) One Design Classes: XOD, YOD, Folkboat (British or Nordic Folkboats that comply with NFIA and UKFCA Class Regulations and Rules, as changed herein);
- 2.2 Classes may be amalgamated at the discretion of the RSYC.
- 2.3 Eligible boats are invited to enter by completing an RSYC Entry Form online on the website, and paying an entry fee of £15.00 by Friday 25th April 2025.

3.1 The King's Coronation Races will be a series of two races. The second race will start as soon as possible after the first race.

4. STARTING LINE

- 4.1 Starts will be from a committee boat.
 - (a) The main committee boat may be "COUNTDOWN", identified by a blue hull with 'RSYC Committee Boat" thereon.
 - (b) The starting line will be between an orange flag on the committee boat and the course side of the distance mark

5. TIME LIMIT

- 5.1 RRS 35 time limit for all classes is 90 minutes. The latest time to finish after the first boat finishes is 15 minutes, or the RRS 35 time limit, whichever is the later.
- 5.2 When no boat in the race completes the course within the time limit, the results of the race will be determined by the placing of the boats through the start/finish line when '\(^1\)' is a mark of the course.

6. FINISHING LINE

6.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the committee boat and the course side of the finishing line outer distance mark.

7. SCORING

7.1 The races will be scored as provided in RRS Appendix A using the Low Point system.

8. RACE MANAGEMENT

8.1 Handicaps, if appropriate, will be determined by the race committee or its nominee.

9. SAFETY/RISK STATEMENT/INSURANCE

9.1 Attention is drawn to the Royal Solent Yacht Club SI 17 and 18.

10. PRIZES

- 10.1 Prize Giving will be held in the RSYC after racing on Bank Holiday Monday 5th May.


