**66/25 Approval of 17<sup>th</sup> July 2025 Minutes** The Minutes were approved as a true record.

Winter Programme Events.

- The Events Manager advised that the Winter programme (October to April) is complete up to December with the usual member activities. However, it would be good to schedule some different member events.
- The Events Manager has planned a Commodore's Supper in early February with a talk about the first ever "America's Cup" around the Isle of Wight. The speaker lives in Cowes and won't charge for the event as he'll use it to promote his book at a discounted rate.
- The Club re-opens on 20<sup>th</sup> January and Burns Night will be held on 24th January as it was popular last year, and a film night is planned for 22<sup>nd</sup> January.
- From the end of October this year, the Events Manager is planning to show classic films on Tuesday afternoons, which will be good for those members who don't like coming out after dark in the Winter. It was agreed that we could promote any winter warmer deal on Tuesday lunchtime, followed by the film with tea/coffee and cake in the interval at a charge of £5 a head.
- A final fundraising event for the HIOWAA was proposed in the form on a Bingo Night on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> December – the viability of this date will be discussed at the staff meeting tomorrow. [Post meeting, this date was confirmed as viable with the staff.]
- A Spring Ladies' Lunch will be added to the programme; RCH advised that Madeleine Green has a friend who's a dietician who could give a talk. **RCH**
- Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> March is free for a Club event – possibly another bingo night or a casino night? Costing of Casino Night to be looked into. **EM**
- It was agreed that a Murder Mystery Night should be booked in now for Spring 2027. **EM**
- RCH requested that the Dash in the Dark in aid of the HIOWAA on 4<sup>th</sup> October be promoted to members. **EM**

New Year's Eve Party. The Wight Hot Pipes are booked at a cost of £1k, set times are tbc but suggested as 21:30 – 22:30 and 23:00 – 00:00, with welcome drinks at 20:00 and the finger buffet from 20:30. The finger buffet would have a first stage of savouries and a second stage of desserts and cheese. It was proposed by RCH that the band play in the members' lounge and dining room, which would require a limit on numbers of 100. Round tables would be provided for attendees to sit at whilst eating, but it was felt that with a finger buffet all 100 attendees would not need to be seated at the same time and that no seating plan was required. The Events Manager suggested a Hogmanay theme as the band involves bagpipes and kilts, so a "touch of tartan" dress code was suggested, along with tartan serviettes, thistles in the flowers and a whiskey based welcome drink in addition to a Prosecco based alternative. **Ticket price tbc. EM**

Summer Party 2026. Jules suggested Country & Western theme and recommended an Island band called **Honky-Tonk Highway which plays modern country music – availability and price tbc. EM** Everyone agreed that this would be a good theme.

150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The Club's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary is in 2028. The Events Manager suggested an RSYC Proms with the IW Symphony Orchestra, Zita Symes and others playing music composed around 1878, with a formal dinner before the music – potentially in the Towers garden if that can be agreed with John Caulcutt. The Secretary added that it would be fantastic to have a fly past by Spitfires or Red Arrows with as many members as possible standing on the balconies and colonnade, all filmed by a drone. It was noted that it's also the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Taittinger RSYC Regatta in 2028.

Halloween 2026. The Events Manager suggested that a party is held on Halloween next year as the 31<sup>st</sup> October is a Saturday. RCH suggested local music duo Hodge & Allen who are her neighbours.

Meal Statistics. RCH advised that the Events Manager had provided some interesting statistics for the GC meeting last month, showing that the Club had produced 3,836 meals in 6 weeks during the period 19<sup>th</sup> June to 8<sup>th</sup> August, which is an incredible achievement. Jules congratulated all the staff for their efforts in what has been a very busy year, and RCH commented that other Clubs are always so complimentary of our staff, food and event organisation.
