## 37/24 Matter Arising from Minutes

Future Talks. Motivational speaker, Kate Taylor, responded to the Events Manager that her fee is £250, which is outside our budget. Light Bites. It was still felt by all that at £6 each or 2 for £9.99 for members the light bites on Wednesday evenings are too expensive for the portion size. Should dirty/cheesy fries be promoted instead? Could the offering be refreshed more often? Scampi, jalapeno bites, halloumi fries. Could a jacket potato option also be added to the Wednesday supper menu? (Which received good feedback especially today's ploughmans). NYE Brunch. It would be difficult to move this to New Year's Day rather than New Year's Eve due to low staffing levels on New Year's Day. Caroline suggested a 'pick me up' promotion on New Year's Day on Bloody Marys and Bucks Fizz and easy to make carbs, such as chips. The Events Manager suggested a special offer for those members who attend the NYE brunch of 10% off NYE party tickets next year, which all thought to be a good idea. The NYE Brunch menu needs to be different from the Christmas Eve brunch menu so the Head Chef will be asked for ideas. It was felt it should be kept simple in terms of having no dress code, theme or different décor and not too expensive. The Secretary suggested a special offer on Champagne (Taittinger Nocturne?) and it was felt this should be extended to Prosecco too. It was felt that the NYE party next year should be relaxed and cheaper and Helen suggested karaoke, which all thought would work well in conjunction with a DJ for dancing later on.
