- 15th May, Royal Southern YC Dinner – 22

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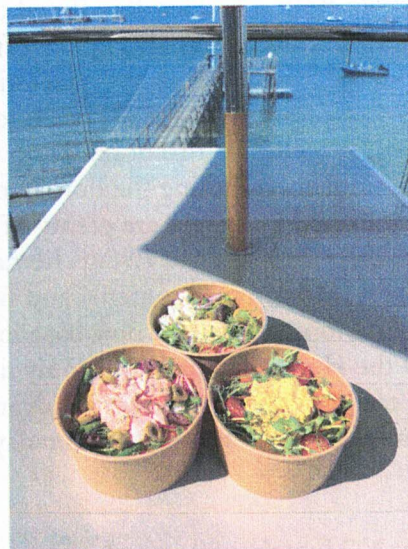
