**33/24 CRO Report**

The diamond by Grants needs maintenance, TB to work on this when he has ideal tidal conditions. TB Yarmouth Harbour slipway has had a barrier installed which is proving controversial as it blocks launching and recovery. NB to investigate getting a key for RSYC members (as YSC and boatyards). TB to see Scott

There was an issue with personal watercraft landing on the beach off the RSYC and a RIB driving up the beach whilst people were swimming. After contacting the Yarmouth Harbour Master, RSYC has been requested to display "NO MOORING BY ORDER OF THE HARBOUR MASTER". MC expressed concerned regarding this situation as it could get dangerous very quickly. The marine police could be called if the problem worsened.

YSC met with the Sailing Office to discuss bringing their Picos over to join with Wednesday Evening Racing, they would like to bring their Picos (8 maximum) over occasionally when the tide is flooding.

Mark Lacey: This month saw 12 XODs sailing and the conclusion of the first Wednesday and Sunday series with X115 *MIX* winning the Heneage Finch Beaker and Hayles Trophy respectively. X175 *XENON* won the Wednesday Evening Racing Class Three series. The Kiszely Trophy to Warden buoy was postponed due to bad weather.

Six XODs completed two passage races to and from Gins farm on the Beaulieu River along with two motor boats where they met three XODs from Cowes. A pleasant lunch for 34 people was enjoyed at Gins farm. The race back to Yarmouth was a crew race with Freddie Davies winning this race but X115 *Mix* winning the overall passage trophy, a combination of the two races. Cordelia and Richard Ellis on *MYRTLE* and James Meaning on *GLEAM* both sailed at Lymington Week and both finished mid fleet in a very competitive fleet. This coming month sees Keelboat Week at Itchenor and Cowes Classic week where several boats from Yarmouth will be representing the RSYC.
